Welcome to the magical world of digital imaging! In this class we create works of art using the tools of digital photography: digital SLR cameras, computers, Adobe Photoshop, and inkjet printers. We will learn how to see and create by studying past masters of photography and their techniques, by evaluating our own work and the work of our classmates, and by connecting our unique vision to culture and history. We work on project-based, interpretative assignments in a creative environment to refine our own artistic expressions.

- a. Using only 1 exposure, create a well exposed, focused & composed image that shows what you have learned so far this year. If the image is deleted, you fail.
- b. Complete evaluation on steps leading up to pressing the shutter button and explain how you chose your settings.
- c. After uploading image, complete self-evaluation discussing the following: Why would you consider your image 'fine art,' use photography and art vocabulary? What did you do well? Did you make any mistakes and if so how would you fix them?

 - c. Photoshop Techniques- Layer Mask, Levels, Curves
- 17. **Photo Assignment: Non-Literal Self Portraits** submit two final images of non-literal self portrait photography (signature, projection, self-study, fantasy), digital contact sheet of 40 images minimum, turn files into 'common drive', self-evaluation, and present images during class critique.
 - a. Masters of Self-Portraiture Assignment
 - b. Photos- Focus on planning a conceptual photo, applying previous techniques, taking self-portrait image
 - c. Photoshop Techniques- portrait retouching & non-destructive adjustments

- 18. **Photo Assignment: Studio Portrait** submit one retouched/edited image of a studio light portrait, digital contact sheet of 15 images minimum, turn files into 'common drive', self-evaluation, and present images during class critique
- a. Photo Techniques- use incident light meter, set up studio mono lights, create traditional lights on portrait subject (side, Rembrandt, loop, butterfly), practice posing techniques
 - b. Photoshop Techniques- portrait retouching
- 19. **Photo Assignment: Non-Literal Portraits** submit one retouched/edited image of non-literal portrait photography (signature, projection, self-study, fantasy), digital contact sheet of 40 images minimum, turn files into 'common drive', self-evaluation, and present images during class critique
 - a. Masters of Portraiture Assignment
 - b. Photos- Focus on planning a conceptual photo, applying previous techniques and working with a client
 - c. Photoshop Techniques- portrait retouching & raw processing
- 20. **Photo Assignment: Triptych/Series** submit one edited triptych or series photograph; turn file into 'common drive', self-evaluation, and present images during class critique.
 - a. Masters of Triptych/Series Assignment
 - b. Photos- Focus on planning a conceptual series & applying previous techniques
 - c. Photoshop Techniques- Creating a triptych or series in Photoshop
- 21. **Photo Assignment: Word & Image** submit one edited image that incorporates word and image, self-evaluation, and present images during class critique.

Outside Assignments:

Critical Thinking:

Assignments will be given simulating a real world commissioned shooting job. The student must analyze and formulate image ideas that fulfill the client's needs. The shooting set will be prepared and the shots taken. The cost of the job will be assessed and an invoice prepared.

Required Writing:

On each assignment, the student is required to create a sketch. They write a reflection to post along with their images on their website, reflecting on problems incurred, evaluation of process, techniques, and finished result.
